- Training to support doctors to treat other doctors
- Education, sponsorship, advocacy (along with the other states), research.

Why doctors seek a doctor

- Physically unable to assess or treat themselves
- Objectivity in care
- Confidential
- Advocacy with other treating doctors
- Access to different knowledge base
- Better coordination of care
- Better record keeping
- Medicolegal protection
- · Healing, peaceful experience



Why doctors might not seek their own doctor

Any professional

- Time off during day
- Work commitments
- Proximity

Doctors

- Difficult to choose who to see
- Confidentiality
- Stigma
- Don't want to appear stupid or ignorant
- Trivialising illness
- Embarrassing (esp. mental, reproductive)
- Waiting room tension
- Bad previous experiences
- Medical Board reporting
- Feel they could do a better job themselves
- Ability to treat themselves instead



The successful doctor-patient consultation

ABCD QRST

- Acknowledgement, and thanks
- Boundaries and billing
- Confidentiality
- Do not judge



The successful doctor-patient consultation

ABCD QRST

- Quick access
- Referrals, scripts, investigations the concept of blended care
- Shared decision making and shared responsibility
- The 4 Ts time, talent, trust, TLC



The Doctors for doctors list

- For GPs who are happy to see doctors and patients, and prioritise them.
- No obligation to see within a specific time frame
- No obligation to bill any differently to your usual practice
- Support from DHASWA including our psychiatry and occupational health advisers



The Advice Line

- Confidential health-related triage, advice and referral services for doctors and medical students
- Speak to a doctor from WA, who understands the WA health system, WAbased training systems
- Confidential exempt from mandatory reporting
- Anonymous if you like
- Calls routed through WADMS return call within 4 hours
- NO CALLER ID
- Talk for as long as you need, about anything you need to talk about
- We get 3-4 calls a week, 25% Doctors in Training
- We can facilitate and fast-track inpatient and outpatient care
- Follow up, if needed
